LIP BALM INSTRUCTIONS

SUPPLIES



Lip balm base • Lip color • Lip flavor
Lip balm tubes • Bowl • Spoon
Funnel • Cutting machine (optional)
Self-adhesive vinyl (optional)

Melt lip balm base in bowl according to manufacturer's instructions. Mix in colors and flavors as desired.

2



Use funnel to pour melted lip balm base into tube and let set overnight.

3



Optional: Create and cut labels from self-adhesive vinyl with cutting machine and adhere to tubes.

FEELING MARBLEOUS

To create this swirling effect, divide a bath bomb mixture into thirds, add a few drops of soap dye to two parts, and layer the different-colored mixtures into a mold. Give the mix a minute to set, and then remove your marble masterpiece from the mold.



PETALS & PAMPERING

When it comes to aromatherapy, bath bombs and dried florals go hand-in-hand! These petal-topped pretties feature fragrant rose, lavender, cornflower and chamomile.

***Tip:** To make sure they're visible, sprinkle the petals into the bath bomb mold before the rest of the ingredients.*

BATH BOMB INSTRUCTIONS

SUPPLIES



Baking soda - 1 cup • Epsom salt - 1/2 cup
Cornstarch - 1/2 cup • Citric acid - 1/2 cup
Water - 1/2 tsp - 1 tsp • Metal bath bomb mold • Essential oil (optional) - 5-10 drops
Measuring cups & spoons • Bowls • Spoon

Mix all dry ingredients until no clumps are present. Set aside. Mix all wet ingredients in separate bowl, then slowly add to dry ingredients until texture resembles wet sand.

Pour mixture into mold, overfilling each side. Press sides together, and wipe away excess mixture from mold.

Gently remove bath bomb from mold and let dry overnight.



BATH TIME BLOOMS

Consider forming your bath bombs using soap molds—they come in all kinds of interesting shapes. Case in point: These sudsy blooms came from a wildflower mold.

P.S. After unmolding, add colorful details with some soap dye and a paintbrush.

TINY TREATS

Leftover bath bomb mix? Create miniature bath bombs for a future spa day! The process for making these baby bubblers is the same, but you'll fill and press together two same-sized measuring spoons, rather than an entire metal mold.



ODE TO GEODE

The key to this rockin' look: Before pouring bath bomb ingredients into your mold, add a layer of bath salts first. When you unmold the bath bomb, most of the salts will fall away, leaving a craggy surface. Then adhere coarse bath salts on top using melted soap base.





ON THE COVER: Melted lip balm base + sugar = homemade lip scrubs! Want to go the extra mile? Try adding grapeseed oil (to freshen your lips) and freeze-dried fruit (for natural flavor).



SUNDAE FUNDAY

The inside scoop on these ice cream bath bombs? There's no mold required! Simply spoon your bath bomb mixture onto parchment paper (a cookie scoop is great for this). Then let the bombs dry overnight, and you're ready for a dip in the tub!

SWEET TREAT

These cupcake bath bombs feature a foamy frosting.

Here's the recipe: Mix whipped soap base (1 cup), glycerin (1 tbsp) and meringue powder (3 tbsp). Then dissolve melt & pour soap (1 ¼ cups), blend it with the previous ingredients, and pipe the mixture with a piping bag.
