Bath Bombs and Lip Balms

La Vie En Rose

The trick to getting a peekaboo lip balm rose is to mold it with a fondant mold (sold with the baking molds). Just be sure the lip balm in the container is still soft, so you can slip the hardened roses right in.

Cross My Heart

Want a romantic spin on the traditional bath bomb? Try putting rose petals in a heart-shaped mold before adding the bath bomb mixture.

Tip: For even more luxury, make rose-shaped bath bombs with a silicone mold.



Lip Service

Here's an idea to try: Fill small tins (included with the lip balm kit) with lip balm, then decorate the lids with stickers!

Psst... We added cosmetic glitter to our lip balm, because why not?



Treat Deal

For sugary sweet bath bombs, use donut molds. After the donuts have dried, dip the tops into melted goat milk soap for glaze. Then top it off with some sprinkled fun. P.S. The donut molds and the sprinkles are from the baking section.



Good to Gift

A gathering of spa-day goodies not only makes a gift fit for a queen—it's also your DIY time to shine. After you've made a few supplies of the same scent and color scheme, use them to fill a wood tray (this one comes with handles).



Gloss Over

What's a lip balm without a lip scrub? Lucky for you, the lip balm kit includes what you need to make your own.

Pretty up some metal tins (we used a recycled candy tin) with patterned paper and twine, fill them with balm and scrub, and give them to your friends!



Crystal Clear

Geode bath bombs? Yes, please. Fill half of a bath bomb mold with the bath bomb mixture, leaving a dip in the middle. Fill the rest of the mold with soap-dyed sea salt. **Tip:** Pour liquid coconut oil over the bomb to seal in the salt.



Bombs Away

For bath bombs that sparkle with luxury, look to luster dust and cosmetic glitter. Luster dust: Use it as a paint or mix it in your bath bomb mixture before molding. Glitter: Pour a little into the molds before filling them. Add sea salt (you can paint it too!) to your bomb for texture.



Best Buds

The key to getting tiny bath bombs like these is to use a miniature square silicone mold. It makes 24 small molds, which are perfect for easy gifting. **Tip:** Sprinkle lavender buds into the mold before tightly packing in the bath bomb mixture for a look like this.

Zest Wishes

If you're all about presentation, then you'll love these bath bombs that double as a fruity decoration. Poke a small hole in your bomb before it dries to accommodate a faux stem and leaves. Psst... Use a mixture of lip color pigment and soap dye to get the bright orange color you see here.





Sundae Stroll

Here's the scoop: Form bath bombs with an ice cream scoop to give it the texture of ice cream. For chocolate syrup, mix cocoa powder with melted goat milk soap, turning your bathroom into an ice cream-themed dream.

Rock Solid

Want shimmery gemstone bath bombs like ours? Use luster dust! It's found with the baking supplies and it's nontoxic, so feel free to add a little (or a lot) to your gems.

Tip: Use multiple colors of soap dye when mixing your bath bomb to get this marbled look.
