## FLAIR WEAR

### ON THE COVER

*Dyed t-shirt with screen-printed design—grab an all-in-one screen-printing kit to get started.*

## TO DYE FOR

The color palette for this kiddo's long-sleeve tee and bucket hat outfit comes from a tie-dye kit—it's one of many multi-color packs that has everything you need to make your own designs, like this classic bullseye pattern!



## DESIGNER DINOS

Here are the deets on this dino-mite DIY: Cut two of each letter out of felt (one set  $\frac{1}{4}$ " smaller than the other), layer them, and embroider around them. Then back the letters with fusible web and iron them onto a t-shirt.



## DESIGNER DUDE

Sport iron-on is a great choice when it comes to clothing for active kids! It's a lightweight material that's perfect for kiddos on the go—because it's stretchy and strong for playtime all day long. We ironed our little dude's design onto a cotton t-shirt, but you can use just about any textile.





## TEES FOR TWO ▲

With endless iron-on options, including this trendy leopard style, creating matching tees is a breeze! To mimic this mommy-daughter look, mix Rose Quartz (4 tbsp) and Coral ( $\frac{3}{4}$  tsp) liquid dye, and color an adult and a youth t-shirt. Then let them dry before adding iron-on designs.

## GLITTER GIRL ►

For this belle of the ball style, cut the letters from glitter iron-on and iron them onto a toddler tee. Then top off the design with an iron-on rhinestone crown applique. And a birthday bash outfit like this isn't complete without a readymade ruffle tutu!





## NEWBORN, NEW THREADS

The embroidered design (backed with fusible stabilizer) on this dyed creeper features three types of stitches: chain stitch for the name and satin and running stitches for the floral motif.

*Tip:* Trace your design onto the creeper with a disappearing ink marking pen before stitching.

## STYLISH SOCKS

Put some pep in your kiddo's step! Daisies: Stitch pompoms to a felt circle. Rainbows: Wrap embroidery floss around lengths of cording, sew them to a piece of felt, and add pompom clouds.



## PATCH PERFECT

No matter your kids' style, we've got tons of patches and appliques they can wear to express themselves. Our wide array includes both single iron-ons and a variety of multi-packs.

**Pro Tip:** Since denim can withstand high heat, iron your patches twice—first on top, then on the backside.



## WEAR & FLAIR

When the goal is to create customized kids' clothing with style, iron-on designs are one of our favorite ways to get there. For a layered look like this, you don't even have to wait for your iron-on to cool before adding more layers. Just place the designs, iron, and repeat!

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
