FRUITFUL FLORALS

Including faux fruit within a bouquet will boost the overall realism of the piece. In this case, a set of decorative pears matched nicely with our chosen florals, adding another organic element to the arrangement.

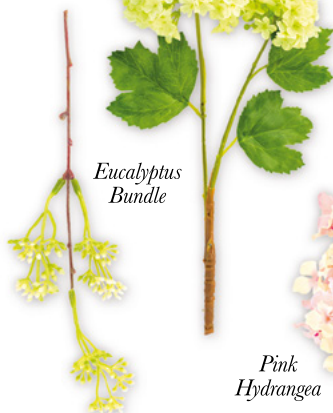

STEP 1

If using a stemming machine, first attach steel picks to clipped hydrangea stems.

Otherwise, insert stems into floral foam, covering top of vase.

STEP 2

Add varying lengths of greenery, including snowball branches. Longer stems will add size to the arrangement.

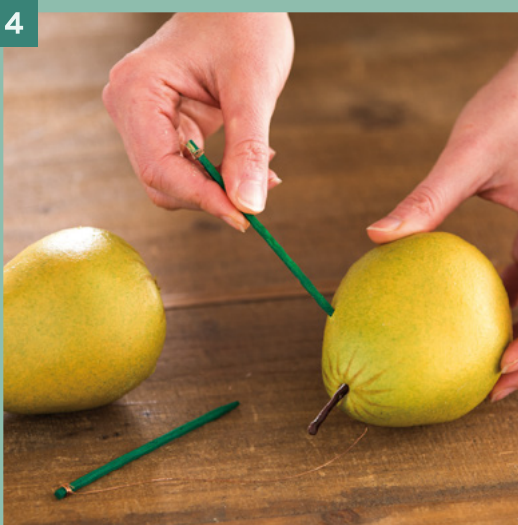

STEP 3

Clip Sophia rose and dahlia stems short, but cut ranunculus stems long for an asymmetrical aesthetic. Add confetti Caroline roses for an extra pop of color.

STEP 4

Poke pears with wooden picks and insert into foam.

STEP 1

Stretch frosted eucalyptus garland across table.



STEP 2

Clip and arrange blue and green berries and cream anemone flowers. Secure with floral wire.





STEP 3

Wire in magnolia flowers and leaves (brown side up for contrast). Add pussy willow branches.



STEP 4

Fill in gaps with berry stems or additional florals.



FLORAL FAVE

This beautiful paper mache box is bursting with blooms! How? Combine unique floral elements from multiple bouquets. We started with a pink and white rose, peony and dahlia bouquet, added white anemone, and embellished with some greenery. **Tip:** Use floral foam to secure flowers.



POTTED PRAISE

Want to spruce up potted ivy on the front porch? Realistic faux flowers are the answer! Pair the dangling greenery with an aesthetically pleasing combo: white hydrangea blooms and light green snowball branches, placing them at varying heights for a natural look.

BEST BUNCH

Don't be afraid to bundle bunches of blooms, bushes and branches into a petite planter. A full and rich look is ideal, and variety equals vibrancy.

Tip: *Pick a color scheme and work it through evenly. We chose pinks and greens for a fun and fresh feeling.*



TOP PICKS

Even a floral first-timer can build this ambitious bouquet. Begin with a few pink hydrangea picks in the center and work out with progressively smaller blooms.

Add greenery and faux mini oranges throughout for fullness.

P.S. Loose fern leaves at both ends will create a natural flow.

SPRAY ON DISPLAY

Give your bouquet a blast of volume by leaving stems longer, allowing them to extend out. For this look, we paired eucalyptus with purple delphinium and spread them horizontally.

Cut two pink and cream peony stems from the bush and center them for a symmetrical finish.



GREEN GIFT

Show your gratitude with a little greenery. This botanical beauty is quick to make but will leave a lasting impression.

Fill a mason jar with decorative stones and then assemble an assortment of picks, sprays and succulents. **Tip:** Include a floral focal point, like a white ranunculus bloom.



PRETTY PINK

Take your faux florals to the next level by incorporating imitation water. First fill a glass vase with clear resin (sold in the Floral Department). Then style tulips or other long-stem flowers as desired. Let the arrangement sit undisturbed at least 10 hours while the resin cures.





PICK PRO

Upgrade your floral game with a professional stemming machine. This valuable tool automatically places a steel floral pick on a stem with just the pull of a lever. Steel picks keep your arrangements more stable, especially in outdoor conditions.

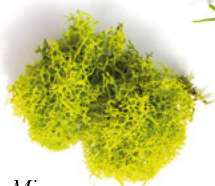
