

Basic Floral Arrangements

STEP 1

If using a stemming machine, first attach steel picks to clipped hydrangea stems.
Otherwise, insert stems into floral foam, covering top of vase.

STEP 2

Add varying lengths of greenery, including snowball branches. Longer stems will add size to the arrangement.




STEP 3

Clip Sophia rose and dahlia stems short, but cut ranunculus stems long for an asymmetrical aesthetic. Add confetti Caroline roses for an extra pop of color.



STEP 4

Poke pears with wooden picks and insert into foam.















BEST BUNCH

Don't be afraid to bundle bunches of blooms, bushes and branches into a petite planter. A full and rich look is ideal, and variety equals vibrancy. **Tip:** Pick a color scheme and work it through evenly. We chose pinks and greens for a fun and fresh feeling.



TOP PICKS

Even a floral first-timer can build this ambitious bouquet. Begin with a few pink hydrangea picks in the center and work out with progressively smaller blooms

Add greenery and faux mini oranges throughout for fullness P.S. Loose fern leaves at both ends will create a natural flow.

SPRAY ON DISPLAY

Give your bouquet a blast of volume by leaving stems longer, allowing them to extend out. For this look, we paired eucalyptus with purple delphinium and spread them horizontally. Cut two pink and cream peony stems from the bush and center them for a symmetrical finish.





PRETTY PINK

Take your faux florals to the next level by incorporating imitation water. First fill a glass vase with clear resin (sold in the Floral Department). Then style tulips or other long-stem flowers as desired. Let the arrangement sit undisturbed at least 10 hours while the resin cures.
