These galvanized metal chairs got a quick and easy makeover using spray paint and the Krylon® Snap & Spray™ Gun.

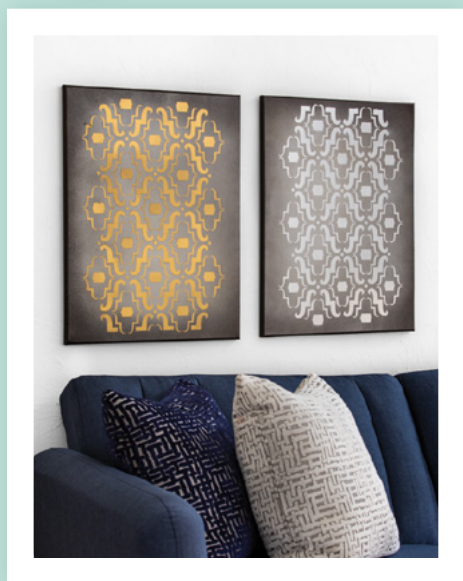


HOBBY LOBBY®



POSITIVELY LUMINOUS

A basic paper lantern becomes a fetching focal point with the help of Krylon® Glitter Blast™ spray paint. Begin with one or two layers and then add progressively more if you want a deeper, saturated look. We varied the application amounts from top to bottom to achieve an ombre effect.



STENCIL IT IN

DIY home decor is a cinch with the help of stencils and metallic spray paint. Start by covering canvases with layers of spray paint in Rubbed Bronze, Nickel and Champagne for dimension and depth. After canvases dry, apply Silver Foil and Gold Foil spray paint over stencils to complete the look.



CHARMING CHALK

Accent tables take on a farmhouse feel with the aid of Krylon® Chalky Finish spray paint. For this bedside table, we layered Slate and Mink colors and let them dry, then lightly sanded the edges for an aged, distressed appearance.



MERCURY MASTERPIECE

Nothing creates that coveted vintage vibe quite like a mercury glass mirror. In this project, we inserted pretty scrapbook paper behind the glass for added interest.

Materials: 16 x 20" frame and glass, Silver Krylon® Looking Glass® spray paint, spray paint for frame, spray bottle of vinegar, 12 x 12" scrapbook paper, spray adhesive and paper towels

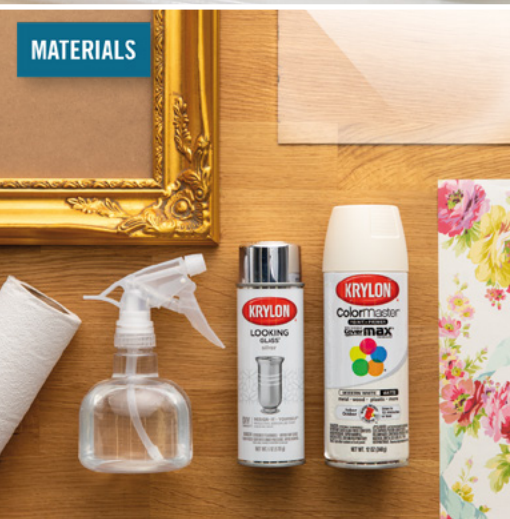
Step 1: Spray a few areas of glass with vinegar.

Step 2: While still wet, cover entire glass surface with Krylon® Looking Glass® spray paint.

Step 3: Once paint has dried, blot any vinegar-covered areas with a paper towel.

Step 4: Spray paint frame and let dry.

Step 5: Secure patterned paper to frame backing with spray adhesive and mount behind glass.

SEASIDE TREASURES

Use Krylon® Sea Glass spray paint to effortlessly transform decorative glass objects. We created a drippy, mottled look by covering ornaments and bottles with a few layers of paint and then applying an alcohol-ink blending solution before they dried.



FOIL THE FOLIAGE

You can make ordinary leaves look extraordinary with artfully applied spray paint. To start, spray faux leaves with thin coats of paint and let dry. Next, attach them to watercolor paper using hot glue and insert them into black collage frames. **Tip:** Use floral cutters to trim leaves to desired size.

MAKE AN ENTRANCE

Pretty pastels complement muted gray for a soft, inviting environment. Spray mantel shelves and flower wall hooks with Krylon® Short Cuts® spray paint in Matte Shadow Gray, Cactus Green, Bonnet Blue and Satin Rose Petal. Let dry and then lightly distress edges with sandpaper.





▲ ELEMENTAL DESIGN

Shiny metallics play off coarse stone with geometric precision on these striking planters. To begin, cover areas designated for metallic paint with painter's tape. Apply several coats of Krylon® Stone Coarse-Textured spray paint. Remove tape and protect previously painted areas by covering with paper. Finish by applying even layers of metallic spray paint.

▲ STEP THINGS UP

Add instant charm to your garden or patio with colorful hanging planters on a leaning ladder. We painted a black wood ladder white with Krylon® Outdoor Décor satin spray paint and then finished it with clear sealer. For the planters, we used Sunflower, Blue Lagoon, Iris and Wild Grass spray paint.
