# Garden Fairy

Tulle starts at the top in this DIY costume. We wrapped lavender and grey mist tulle around ribbons and then alternated the colors to create the bodice. Tulle roses secured to the waist and headband complete this fairytale look.





## Ring Master

We embellished Simplicity 1786 with gold rick rack and frog closures on this ring master's vibrant vest. The costume comes full circle with a mini top hat headband, gold bowtie and a "ring of fire" made from a hula hoop and felt.



## Wonder Girl

This superhero's logo was cut from felt and adhered to a t-shirt with fabric glue. We gave a basic eye mask a heroic makeover with the help of a blue felt base and gold felt stars.

**Tip:** Match extra tulle to the blue and yellow sections for a fuller tutu.

### Basic Tutu Construction:

All of our tutus can be made by tying strips of tulle around an elastic band and securing with lark's head knots.





## *Merry Mermaid*

We chose Simplicity 8725 for the top of our mermaid's costume but opted for a halter-top neckline and added decorative tulle and a darling brooch. For the cage skirt, we wove glitter tulle over a long green tutu, securing it with thread and adding rhinestone embellishments.

# Glittering Unicorn

The top of this costume was crafted using an iron-on unicorn applique and silver glitter letters. Then we maximized the sparkle by sewing holographic ribbon to the bottom of the tutu. For the finishing touch, we embellished a unicorn headband with flowers from a floral festival crown.

**Tip:** Stretch tulle as you sew ribbon on tutu to create more curl.





## Fetching Fawn

We threaded rows of alternating shades of brown and creme tulle through the holes of a crocheted elastic band for this darling deer's tutu. The fawn's ears and antlers were cut from brown and creme felt, secured to a headband, and accented with tiny pink flowers.



## Fiery Fox

We kept the top of this costume simple by securing an ivory felt oval to a white t-shirt with fusible web. But when it came to the ears and tail we got pretty foxy—both were constructed by tying tulle around chenille stems and then shaping and trimming as necessary.



## Beaming Bumblebee

A jaunty striped bow accent makes this tiny tutu worth buzzing about. For the top, we cut a bee shape out of iron-on vinyl, incorporating stripes to coordinate with the bow. Tulle pompoms and chenille stems secured to a headband complete the costume.
