Telltale Tags

Picture This

Give picture holders a geometric edge with the help of Creative Paperclay® and pops of color. Just form a rectangular block, cut around the piece with a sculpting tool, and then insert a card holder on the top. Once it dries, paint select flat surfaces with acrylic or chalk paint.





Neighborhood Nook

Little houses are big fun for crafters of all ages. We cut and molded Creative Paperclay® into shape, using a craft knife to add details, doors and windows. Once the clay was completely dry, we painted and glazed one side at a time—allowing at least an hour drying time per side.

Natural Beauty

We crafted these lovely leaves from Model Air® Porcelain Clay, etching veins in them with toothpicks and placing them over concave dishes to maintain their shape while drying. To finish, we sanded the edges smooth and applied gorgeous shades of green paint.





Tiered & Tasseled

Make this macrame-inspired wall hanging by cutting shapes from DAS® Air Dry Clay and covering them with a soothing palette of paint. After the pieces dry, connect them with jump rings and add two layers of tassels.

Knot for Nothing

This ornamental bowl pulls double duty as a conversation piece and yarn holder.

After making the bowl with Creative Paperclay®, we shaped coils of clay (with acrylic paint for color) into vines, leaves and flowers. Three clay-covered knobs give our bowl a sturdy foundation.







Made with Creative Paperclay®, this vase owes its good looks to a textured pattern and "braided" trim. After rolling clay to a 1/4" thickness, press firmly down on it with an impression mat and remove. For the trim, scratch hatch marks on a clay strip before securing to the disc.

Prettiest Poppy

Vibrant color and fluted edges make this pretty little poppy bowl a standout. We rolled DAS® Terra Cotta Clay to ¼" thickness, cut a circle from it and then molded it on the inside of a fluted bowl. Once it was dry, we painted both the inside and outside in bold poppy colors, adding accents for interest and dimension. To finish the bowl—and make it fully functional—we coated both the inside and outside with resin.





Mother of Pearl

Ready to sculpt something fit for framing? First, cut an organic shape from a thin slab of Activ-Clay™, then just etch in some shallow lines and use wads of paper towels to give it shape while drying. White pearl paint and Dragonfly Glaze® give it a lustrous look.
