GET EVERY ROOM READY FOR AUTUMN WITH
SEASONAL FLORAL PICKS!

TOP TIER

This layered floral arrangement is an easy project for even first-time decorators. Why? Because it doesn't need floral foam, wire or glue. Just arrange fall botanicals, like berry picks, maple leaves, hydrangeas and patterned pumpkins, into a tiered tray.



ALL SET

Mini blooms and blossoms are the perfect size for embellishing smaller accents like napkin rings. Just cover wood rings with cord, then attach floral picks by wrapping their stems around the rings with more cording.



APPLE A DAY

Incorporating metallic accents into a fall tablescape is a great way to create an air of luxury. Try adding hints of gold leaf to decorative red apples for an unexpected color combination that will give a centerpiece warmth and sophistication.



◀ HANG AROUND

Combine eucalyptus sprays and floral pumpkin picks for this harvesttime hanging. Tie four steel rings together into a spherical shape, place a moss-covered foam disc inside, and arrange away (draping the florals out the sides). Then hang with jute.



RING TRUE

A grapevine wreath form is a great starting point for a DIY autumn arrangement. Place larger floral bundles (golden wheat, pampas plumes and panicum) at the base, then layer in the smaller accents (maple leaves and berries) around the rest of the wreath.



MUCH THANKS

Share in the seasonal harvest with a personalized gift basket that's bursting with bunny tails, hydrangeas and chrysanthemums. Woven accessories, like this wicker tray, go great with autumn florals and décor because of their neutral color and natural texture.

DIY chicken wire frame: The openings in the hexagonal pattern make it easy to secure picks, blooms and sprays with floral wire.



IN FRAME ▲

There's more to fall than just the classic oranges and browns. Include cool tones (like blues, greens and purples) and metallics (apply silver leaf to craft pumpkins) to create a trendy, modern look. P.S. Pampas plumes and wild oats inject a wispy, just-gathered feel.

PUMP IT UP ▶

Go beyond the paintbrush, and customize pumpkins with colorful autumn blossoms! For a look like this, hot glue the bigger blooms around the craft pumpkin first, then fill in the rest of the floral ring with smaller fall flowers and greenery.





HAPPY TO HOOP ▲

Help large blooms like dahlias, peonies and ranunculus establish their star status by arranging them around an embroidery hoop—its simplicity ensures that the flowers are what command attention.

Quick tip: Bookend the florals with bundles of grass to add balance to the asymmetrical arrangement.

◀ FALL FINDS

Pumpkin picks (complete with leaves and berries) may be the star of this wreath, but every arrangement needs a strong supporting cast. Secure large blooms like sunflowers and hydrangeas near the pumpkins, then add volume with pampas grass and berry picks.

TURN THE TABLE

Add height and warmth to an autumn bouquet with feathery pampas grass in deep burgundy. The jewel-toned pops of color give the assortment an updated look, while traditional fall picks—eucalyptus, chrysanthemums and thistles—keep the arrangement timeless.



TAKE YOUR PICK

From basic basket to holiday-worthy arrangement: Lay down a base of moss to anchor everything—then layer, layer, layer. Secure statement blooms along the back for height, stagger focals (like a collection of pumpkins) for depth, and add texture-full elements like leaves, cotton and pinecones for dimension.

HARVEST HAUL

Think outside the vase. Opt for an unconventional container (like this metal truck from Home Décor) for an accent piece that's just as noteworthy as the florals inside. Speaking of: This sunflower-and-pinecone bouquet comes readymade!

Tuck some moss into the truck's slats, nestle the bouquet in the bed, and display away!



FRONT RUNNER

Bringing the décor to the table is a tried-and-true way to celebrate the season of gathering and thankfulness. Keep the look on trend by incorporating a mix of classic elements (such as mimosa branches, seteria grass and maple leaves) and unexpected accents, like these buffalo-check place settings and pastel pumpkins.

FALL IN LOVE

Use a large, readymade chrysanthemum bundle to create an arrangement with fullness and height. Then add greenery, grasses and other botanicals to complete the lavish bouquet.

Tip: Tie in neighboring décor with matching florals for a single cohesive look.
