Here are ten ways to get creative with Explorer by Traditions™ jewelry!

1. Beads + stretch cord = quick, handmade bracelets! For a look like ours, go for textured metal beads—they're sold by the strand.
2. Want to DIY some celestial style? Add a sun charm to a ready-to-go galaxy connector bracelet.
3. This dreamy planetary bracelet comes premade. We gave it extra oomph by adding a sparkly moon druzy charm.
4. We made a custom chain for this wanderlust pendant by joining a readymade faceted connector necklace to a string of gem-cut glass beads.
5. Statement earwear coming right up! Pair vibrant tile pendants with gold fan pendants to recreate our look.
6. These globetrotting charms come together in a multipack, so they're just the thing for a quick-take charm bracelet.
7. Looking for a simple DIY? Hang this stone teardrop pendant on a ball link chain necklace—and you're done!
8. To make this on-the-go bracelet, string beads and leaf charms onto stretch cord.
9. We gave these mini airplane and passport charms an edge by connecting them to the chain with a carabiner clasp.
10. These iridescent leaf pendants are showstoppers on their own, so some delicate chain and a pair of tiny rhinestone charms were enough to take them over the top.



BUGGING OUT

This glass cicada pendant hangs from a handmade chain. You can recreate the look by threading earth-toned glass beads onto clear cording, securing the ends to jump rings with crimp beads, and attaching a brass cable chain necklace.



HAPPY CAMPER

Complete with the adorable camper charm, this antique brass pendant makes the perfect focal point for an eclectic assortment of beads and chains. For a layered look, vary the lengths of the strands.



NECK-AND-NECK

Get a bead on these DIY necklaces: The colorful beads are actually made from recycled paper! String them onto clear cording—we added metallic seed beads in between—until the necklace reaches your desired length. Then crimp the ends and finish with a lobster clasp.
