LEAVE IT TO MOSS

Here's a unique way to make tiny trees for miniature scenes: Twist lengths of jewelry wire together to form the trunk and branches, then glue on bits of various mosses to create the canopy.





SPHERE YOU ARE ▲

Mix and match moss spheres, vine topiaries and candleholders to bring a spring centerpiece to life. There's no wrong way to arrange them, but to keep the look unified, use the same elements throughout—we chose a variety of mosses and white blooms.

GREEN HOUSE ▼

Wrap mismatched containers (we used a four-compartment wood box and a terra cotta pot) in adhesive moss mats to create a cohesive look for an herb garden like this. Finish by wrapping them with chicken wire ribbon and handmade air-dry clay tags.





MOSSIN' AROUND ^

Asymmetrical moss wreath, coming right up!

Outer hoop: Accent a wood bead wreath with adhesive moss. **Inner hoop:** Offset and glue two wood rings together, then cover the space between them with a moss mat.

GROW-IT-ALL >

Bet you can't tell this moss-covered umbrella started out as a galvanized metal planter (from the Crafts Dept.!) **On the outside:** reindeer moss and sections of a moss mat.

On the inside: excelsior moss and floral sprays.



THE MOSSIER THE BETTER

We took a cue from nature itself—where greenery grows wherever it wants—to capture this secret-garden aesthetic. Adhere abstract strips of moss (cut from a mat) to primed terra cotta pots, and fill in with bits of forest moss.



On the Cover: Living wall art in three steps: 1) Glue moss mat to foam board. 2) Layer on more moss and add florals. 3) Place foam board in wood frame.



MOSS O'CLOCK

It's time to transform a wood sign into a moss-covered clock! First up: Drill a hole in the center of the sign (to accommodate the clock works). Next up: Cover the sign with a cut-to-size piece of moss mat. And finally: Add the clock works and number.



TAKE A STAND

Bring woodland vibes to your next party with moss-covered cupcake stands. All you need are strips cut from an adhesive moss mat, wood rounds, wood candlesticks and hot glue. (Don't forget to invite the mini ladybugs!).

A-MOSS THE TABLE

Adhesive moss mats are great for covering flat surfaces—just trace and cut! For this table number, we cut one piece the exact size of the number and one piece a bit larger to wrap around the edges.



SMART DECO

Bring a natural element to an art deco wall piece (wood wall décor pallet + cut-to-size birch wood strips + gold leaf) with preserved forest moss.

Tip: Seal the moss with hairspray to keep it from flaking off.
