



1. LEAVE IT TO FELT

The key to the realism of this felt greenery is to connect the leaves with wire that's wrapped in floral tape and to curl the leaves. Keep scrolling for the leaf templates—there are three sizes, which gives the garland its depth and dimension.

2. CUT IT OUT

Back felt sheets with fusible web to make cutting out custom shapes a breeze. The backing provides stability, which means clean lines and a professional-quality finish. The result? A felt project that's polished enough to function as grown-up décor. The (formerly white) lampshade was dyed with alcohol ink.







3. FLORA AND FELT

The leaves of this faux houseplant are made up of four layers of felt, stitched together. A craft wire stem gives them the flexibility and stability they need to look real. Leave an opening at the bottom of each leaf for the wire, and stitch on a tube of felt to cover the end. Then bend the stems into the ideal arrangement.

4. PILLOW FELT

Handmade felt appliques mean endless opportunities for customization. Here, the felt is adhered to the pillow form with fusible web, making this a beginner-friendly DIY. The stitches are decorative.





5. STAY IN PLACE

Try backing felt sheets with stiffened felt for fabric crafts that need to be able to stand on their own. Then grab the templates (just keep scrolling!) for these planters.

TIP: Double layer the regular felt sheets for extra sturdiness.

6. FELT THE ROSES

Lightweight and flexible, felt is a great material for crafts that hang. Adhere the letters to the pennants with fusible web, then embellish with bouquetworthy felt flowers. Here's how to make them: Spiral a circle of felt, then (starting in the center) roll the felt in on itself, gluing to secure.



9. FELT UNDERCOVER

This cover is made of four double-layered pieces of felt: a front, a back and two sides. Leave the top few inches unstitched so the sides can be folded in. Then secure the top corners with strips of leather (just knot them through slits cut into the front and back pieces).

TIP: The letters were cut from faux-leather felt.

HINT: Leave the top and bottom open to make grabbing (and replacing) tissues a cinch.





10. WREATHED IN FLOWERS

DIY felt flowers are just a few snips and dabs of glue away. Ruffled: Four scalloped circles of felt, tri-folded and glued together. Poppies: Six felt circles layered and glued together, with fringed and rolled strip of felt in center. P.S. The beaded wreath comes readymade from the Floral Department!



















FELT HOME DECOR ANIMAL BAG (2 OF 2)








FELT HOME DECOR GARLAND




FELT HOME DECOR SIX-SIDED PLANTER
