JUMP RINGS








- 1. Grasp jump ring with a pair of pliers on either side.
- **2.** Carefully bend jump ring ends away from each other to create gap for adding jewelry components.
- **3.** Bend jump end rings back together to close. If gap forms, carefully push ends together.

PLAIN LOOP







WRAPPED LOOP



Using round nose pliers, grab wire as shown and bend it to a 90-degree angle.



Reposition wire on pliers to desired loop size. Bend wire in opposite direction of 90-degree angle to begin loop.



Curl wire until loop is complete and wire is perpendicular to itself.



Grab and secure loop with pliers. Use another pair of pliers to wrap wire as tightly as possible. Trim excess wire and tighten coil if needed.

WRAPPED LOOP BAIL



Center bead on length of wire 3" or longer. Bend one end of wire straight up over center of bead. Use round nose pliers to wrap end of horizontal wire around it, forming a few coils.



Form wrapped loop with vertical wire from step 1. Wrap end of horizontal wire back down over previously formed coils. Trim excess wire.
