



BUTTERFLY BRUNCH

An array of fluttering friends bring garden party vibes to this tablescape! The napkin rings are butterflies attached to wood rings, and we swapped the floral wire on the butterflies for food-safe gum paste wire to turn them into cake toppers.



BUTTERFLY BIOMES

To recreate these butterfly habitats, glue moss onto the base of a glass dome, and adhere branches, leaves and floral sprays so your butterflies can perch on them.

Tip: Glue the domes onto candlesticks to get this look off the ground.

TIME FOR BIRDS

This little bird built her home in a distressed metal clock. To get it move-in ready, remove the face and back the clock with moss glued to a foam board. Then furnish it with a birdhouse (stained balsa strips), spare sticks and a painted picket fence.





TWEET LULLABY

Our floral embellishments are light as a feather, so you can add them to something as delicate as a mobile. We nestled birds, speckled eggs, nests and cuttings from a pink blossom spray into steel rings to create these floating pieces.





BE EGG-CELLENT

Egg decorating isn't just for Easter you can make these faux eggs shine with gold liquid leaf, or paint them with craft acrylics and wrap yarn around the center. And for a more realistic look, speckle the eggs by flicking paint on with a brush.

FEELING FRUITY

The antiqued look of this gilded fruit starts with terra cotta acrylic paint. Adhere metal leaf in small sections, leaving some of the paint uncovered to mimic weathered gold.

Tip: These lemons and apples are sold on branches, but we cut the stems to add them to the basket.



FRAMED FLUTTERS

The butterflies taking off from this shadow box each come attached to wires. You can cut the wires to different lengths and adhere them to the pad of the shadow box to create the illusion that they're in flight. And their perch is a steel ring, mounted to the box with 24-gauge wire.
