

A KNACK FOR . KNOTS

Give your look a new twist with

STRIKE UP THE BAND

Hats off to this simple, stretchy hat band! Create a diamond pattern with diagonal clove-hitch knots, anchoring both ends to a flexible hair tie—this allows you to use the band on different-sized hats.

▽ EAR & DEAR

For small macrame projects like these earrings, 1mm cotton craft cord is your best friend. It's thin enough to allow for intricate weaving (green), tiny square knots (dark blue) and delicate fringe (light blue).





HANGING AROUND

Clove hitch knots on a wooden macrame ring make for a pendant with natural vibes (find the bare wood beads on the woodcrafting aisle). And the bracelet features etched barrel beads (Jewelry Department) threaded into a pattern of clove hitch knots.

BRACELET IT GO

What do these bracelets have in common? Clove hitch knots! You can intersect the knots to create a crisscrossing pattern, change direction to make a zigzagging design, or work with two colors for a more intricate style.

▽ MACRAME VIPS

Both of these lanyards start with lark's head knots on a swivel snap hook. While the gray one twists along with spiral knots, the white lanyard is a repeating pattern comprised of 30 square knots and a berry knot.





BOHO BEAUTIES

These lightweight necklaces radiate all the boho vibes! The yellow necklace is great for beginners—it's made with simple lark's head knots, tied to a steel ring and unraveled to create fringe. Or, if you've mastered clove hitch knots, try creating a half-circle on a small dowel.

THE BELTWAY

This project begins with a wooden macramé ring—it becomes a closure later. Tie diagonal clove hitch knots to create the "X" pattern, adding etched barrel beads and square knots on either side. Then fill in with four clove-hitch diamonds before beginning the next "X".





READY OR KNOT

To recreate this macrame headband, anchor four lark's head knots to a hair tie, and add a gathering knot. Then tie crisscrossing clove hitch knots to create the design. Finish by securing the ends of the cording to the hair tie with another gathering knot.

Tip: The chevron pattern on the heart earrings is made with two rows of diagonal clove hitch knots.

PICTURE PERFECT

To make this two-toned camera strap, tie eight lark's head knots on a swivel snap hook in a 2-4-2 color pattern. Work your way down with square knots—alternating which color is in front—and secure the end to another snap hook with a wrap knot.

On the Cover:
