Accessorize with stylish
twists on **PLASTIC LACE!**

BOLD GOLD

This plastic lace necklace looks complex, but it's actually just a simple braid knotted over itself. Attach the ends to a necklace chain with bell-shaped cord clamps—then you can add short, decorative chains to create a layered look.



TWIST AND CLIP

Hair clips: Fold two pieces of lace in half to create four strands, and tie them into square knots. Then glue the finished design onto a hair clip. **Earrings:** Tie four strands of lace together with a spiral round square knot. Secure the ends with glue and attach ear wires to finish.



FLOWER POWER

If you can braid, you can make these bracelets! Once the braided lace reaches your desired length, secure the ends with cord crimps and a lobster clasp.

Tip: We added daisy charms (Jewelry Department) to level up the look.



BANGLE ANGLE

These bracelets began with readymade metal bangles from the Jewelry Department. Fold a piece of lace around the bangle, and tie square knots, treating the bangle like a center strand. Then secure with glue—and that's it! No additional findings or clasps required.



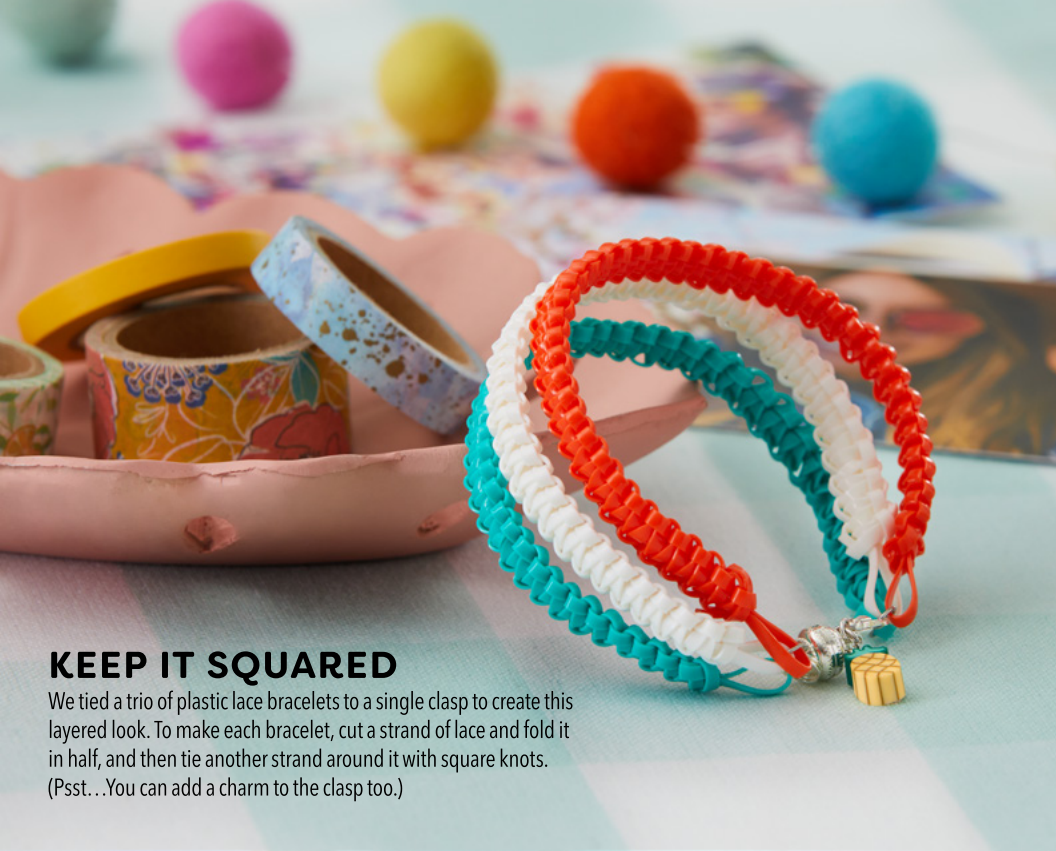
CLASSIC TWIST

There's a reason this keychain is a summer camp favorite—it's easier than it looks! Choose four different lace colors, and tie them together with spiral square knots until you reach your desired length. Secure the ends with a knot, and finish by attaching a keyring to the bottom.



CIRCLE UP

You'll need two steel rings for this pendant (the smaller ring comes in the lace value pack!). Working with two strands, wrap the lace back and forth between the rings, using an infinity pattern to connect them. Then glue on a bail, and attach a chain.



KEEP IT SQUARED

We tied a trio of plastic lace bracelets to a single clasp to create this layered look. To make each bracelet, cut a strand of lace and fold it in half, and then tie another strand around it with square knots. (Psst... You can add a charm to the clasp too.)



ALL TIED UP

Bracelet: Wrap a blank cuff completely with lace and secure with super glue. Then create a woven design on top with additional strands of lace. **Earrings:** Turn simple three-strand monkey fist knots into earrings by gluing them onto posts.



CHECKERBOARD CHIC

Check out this checkerboard keychain: It features a four-strand square knot pattern secured with a bead. For matching hoops, braid plastic lace around beading wire. Glue the ends to round cord clasps, and bend the wire into a loop. Then add ear clips to finish.

LACE ESCAPE

Headband: Cover a blank headband with tie-dye plastic lace, and square knot over it with clear lace.

Earrings: Wrap two-toned plastic lace around a hoop earring, and super glue the ends down. **Bracelet:** With four strands of lace, tie clove hitch knots in a zigzagging pattern. Add cord caps to the ends and attach them together with a toggle clasp.



ON THE COVER:

*To DIY this purse, you'll need:
a plastic canvas purse sheet
(it comes ready to stitch),
a latch buckle, steel rings,
spacer beads, a chain-
and plastic lace, of course!*

TOTALLY TURQUOISE

Both the chain and the pendant on this Southwestern-inspired necklace are made from round-braided plastic lace. Tie one braid into a pipa knot, and attach it to the other braid by wrapping more plastic lace through the loop at the top. Finish with bell-shaped cord ends.
