

# MASON JAR IDEAS

## FLICKERING FLORA

**Garden jar lights in four steps:** 1) Use decoupage medium to adhere pressed flower embellishments (Papercrafts Department) to the inside of a mason jar. 2) Paint the mason jar lid with liquid gold leaf.

3) Wrap twine around the lid and secure it with hot glue. 4) Place an LED candle inside the jar.







*Do not use real candles in these lanterns. We lit ours with LED bottle lights.*

## SHELF HELP

A unique storage solution—you can keep ingredients at hand, in sight and out of the way by attaching mason jar lids to a sturdy shelf.

*Tip: We used screws and a power drill to make sure our jars were super secure.*

## GLASS AGLOW

The secret to the shape of these paper lanterns? We glued circles of EVA foam to the top and bottom of mason jars—for the top circle, cut out an opening so it slides over the mouth of the jar like a collar. Then adhere cardstock (sliced vertically every half-inch) to the foam.



## SIPPING STYLE

Looking for a quick way to turn plain mason jar mugs into a cause for celebration? Permanent self-adhesive vinyl is a great way to go—and if you have a cutting machine, making detailed designs like these is a breeze. Hello, milkshake break!







## LEATHER LAYERS

You can cut, sew, and burn your way to personalized mason jar cozies with DIY leather cozies. Use a leather punching tool to pre-punch holes for stitching, and use a branding tool to add names or decorations.

*Tip: Add laces or a tie to make the cozies easy to take on and off the jars.*

## MASON STATION

Mason jar pumps can easily pep up your sink-side cleaning—just screw them onto the jars like lids! To recreate our look, spray paint each jar and pump, then cut out letters from self-adhesive vinyl and secure them to wood shapes and secure them to wood shapes. Finish by tying on the shapes with jute.



## JAR PARTY

Here's a creative gift idea: Pack a whole party into a single jar! We adhered glitter to the inside of the jar with decoupage medium. (Be sure to let it dry before adding the party supplies.) And for the outside? Unicorn cupcake toppers, rhinestone stickers, scrapbook paper and vinyl cutouts, and a DIY banner.

**ON THE COVER:** It's easy to give a mason jar a terracotta or stoneware look with stone-textured spray paint and chalk paint. We added metal leaf as a flashy finishing touch.
