SET IN STONE

Agates may be the stars of these necklaces, but the chains have quite the supporting role. Mix and match leather cord, faux pearls and bracelet chains to create unique combinations.





TRUE BLUE

These slip-on turquoise bracelets are perfect for first-time jewelry makers. Just string beads onto elastic cording, tie off the ends, and you're ready to grab and go!

CHARMED LIFE

Crafting on a budget? Look for charms (like these shells, starfish and turtles) that come in multipacks. It's a quick, cost-effective way to fill up a bracelet!

On the Cover:

To create these earrings, take apart a leaf and shell drop pendant and add a monstera leaf charm between the pieces. Then connect all three with a jump ring and an ear wire.

PLAY BY EAR

SHELL OUT

Bracelet: Connect charms to a rhinestone and chain bracelet. Earrings: Add charms and beads to gold chains, and attach them to jump rings and ear wires.

BRAVE THE ELEMENTS

Try using a mix of materials, like marble beads with gold chains, for eye-catching contrast. Or bring together wood and wicker for a natural aesthetic.



RISING STAR

Left: These blue beauties feature agate coin beads (they come in a strand) with gemstones and tassels (find them in colorful multipacks). **Right:** Rhinestone starfish and hammered half-circle charms make up the dangling accent pieces on this pair of vibrant earrings.

OFF THE CHAIN **v**

The recipe for turning beads into charms: headpins and a looper tool. For these charms, thread gemstone chip beads onto headpins. Then use a looper tool to cut and curl the ends.

STRING FLING

Left: String beads onto cord, secure ends with crimp beads, and add clasp. Middle: Attach teardrop charm to readymade chain. **Right:** Group charms on jump ring and attach chains.

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
