Crafting with paracord
JUST GOT AN UPGRADE.



▲ BLANKET BOUND

We used two 50" lengths of 550 paracord—tied into vertical lark's head knots and secured to wood rings—to make this trend-forward blanket carrier, complete with wood beads that add both style and support.

◀ WRIST LIST

Pretty in paracord is just a few knots away. **Black Bracelet:** Work two vertical lark's head knots back and forth on both sides of a charm. **Multicolor Bracelet:** With 6" of paracord per color, create a modified chain wrap, adding beads and securing them with a half knot.

CANTEEN DREAM

When even your water bottle has to travel in style, turn to paracord. We brought this bottle holder to life with two knots: cobra knots for the handle and lark's head knots that create the net-like pattern at the top and bottom, separated by simple V's in the middle.



TOTE WORTHY

A paracord purse that's stylish, not just sturdy? This bag (made from strong 550 paracord) fits the bill. For a look like ours, try the Japanese square knot for the base, the simple square knot for the edge, and a vertical lark's head knot for the handle.





KEY POINTS

You can elevate paracord keychains with a touch of gold or silver hardware. Here are the knots we used: **Green:** DNA knot with two strands. **Blue:** Simple figure 8 knot with one strand. **Pink:** Wave knot with two strands. **Purple:** Wave knot secured into a loop.



KNOT JUST JEWELRY

Handmade jewelry doesn't have to mean beads, pendants and pliers. Sometimes it means paracord. Finish off this Celtic-knot jewelry set with whatever findings you like (we chose a lobster clasp and hook ear wires) for lightweight accessories with tons of style points.



ON THE KNOT ▲

Style Tip: You can change up the look of a knot by simply adjusting the tightness. We created this open-weave look by tying 550 paracord into a loose Celtic knot rather than a compact one.

HOOP DE LOOP ►

These simple earrings are beginner-friendly and work up quickly. Just square knot paracord (and turn it into a twist) around a pair of 35mm ready-to-embellish hoop earrings.

Tip: Try thinner size 95 paracord for a delicate look like this.





WALK AND ROLL

Our DIY dog harness features two square knots on the sides and a chain wrap in the center. Create a 29" piece for the leash (this time, make two reverse square knots on the side) and 21" and 28" pieces for the harness. Secure the harness ends with D rings and a breakaway buckle.

PARACORD PROJECTS

PARACORD FANNY PACK (1 of 2)

SKILL LEVEL: Intermediate

ABBREVIATIONS:

- beg** – beginning
- ch** – chain
- ea** – each
- hk** – hook
- rep** – repeat
- rnd(s)** – round(s)
- sc** – single crochet
- scblo** – single crochet in the back loop only
- scflo** – single crochet in the front loop only
- sc2tog** – single crochet 2 together
- sp** – space
- sl st** – slip stitch
- st(s)** – stitch(es)

MEASUREMENTS:

10 ½" X 4" (Completed Main Body)

MATERIALS:

- Silver Gray Paracord Size 95 (12)
- US size J/10 (6 mm) crochet hook
- Yarn needle
- Stitch markers

GAUGE:

16 sts and 14 rows = 4" x 4" square of sc's

INSTRUCTIONS:

MAIN BODY:

Rnd 1: 6 sc in magic ring, sl st to join to beg, ch1. (6)

Rnd 2: 2 sc in ea st around, sl st to join to beg, ch1. (12)

Rnd 3: *2 sc in next st, sc in next st*, rep around. Sl st to join to beg, ch1. (18)

Rnd 4: *sc in next st, 2 sc in next st, sc in next st*, rep around. Sl st to join to beg, ch1. (24)

Rnd 5: *2 sc in next st, sc in next 3 sts* rep around. Sl st to join to beg, ch1. (30)

Rnd 6: *sc in next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 2 sts*, rep around. Sl st to join to beg, ch1. (36)

Rnd 7: *2 sc in next st, sc in next 5 sts*, rep around. Sl st to join to beg, ch1. (42)

Rnd 8: *sc in next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 3 sts*, rep around. Sl st to join to beg, ch1. (48)

Rnd 9: *2 sc in next st, sc in next 7 sts*, rep around. Sl st to join to beg, ch1. (54)

Rnd 10: *sc in next 4 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 4 sts*, rep around. Sl st to join to beg, ch1. (60)

Rnd 11: *2 sc in next st, sc in next 9 sts*, rep around. Sl st to join to beg, ch1. (66)

Rnd 12: *sc in next 5 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 5 sts*, rep around. Sl st to join to beg, ch1. (72)

Rnd 13: 2 sc in next st, sc in next 11 sts*, rep around. Sl st to join to beg, ch1. (78)

Rnd 14: *sc in next 6 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 6 sts*, rep around. Sl st to join to beg, ch1. (84)

Rnd 15: *2 sc in next st, sc in next 13 sts*, rep around. Sl st to join to beg. (90)

Rnd 16: Sc in next 7 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 7 sts* rep around. Sl st to join to beg, ch1. (96)

Rnd 17: *2 sc in next st, sc in next 15 sts* rep around. Sl st to join to beg, ch1. (102)

Rnd 18: *sc in next 8 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 8 sts*, rep around. Sl st to join to beg. Fasten off and weave in ends. (108)

FRONT STRIP:

Ch43.

Row 1: Sc in second ch from hk and each ch across, ch1, turn.

Row 2: Scflo in ea st across, ch1, turn.

Row 3: Scblo in ea st across, ch1, turn.

Row 4: Rep row 2.

Row 5: Rep row 3.

PARACORD FANNY PACK (2 of 2)

Row 6: Rep row 2.

Row 7: Rep row 3.

Row 8: Rep row 2.

Row 9: Rep row 3.

Row 10: Rep row 2.

Row 11: Scblo in each st across, turn and evenly place 12 sc's down side, turn and sc 42 across bottom, turn and evenly place 12 sc's up side. Do not fasten off.

JOIN MAIN BODY AND FRONT STRIP

On main body, count out 42 stitches (this is where the zipper goes), and place a stitch marker at the beginning and end of these stitches. The top 42 stitches of front strip will be part of zipper. The remaining 66 stitches of main piece and remaining 66 stitches of front strip (sides and bottom) will be joined together. Join strip in first stitch before stitch marker. Slip stitch front strip onto main piece, going down side, around bottom and up other side. You should end at next stitch marker. Fasten off.

SIDE STRAPS

Join yarn in one of 12 stitch sides in third stitch.

Row 1: Sc in same joined st and next 7 sts, ch1, turn.

Row 2: Sc in 8 sts, ch1, turn.

Row 3: Sc2tog, sc in next 4 sts, sc2tog, ch1, turn.

Row 4: Sc in 6 sts, ch1, turn.

Row 5: Sc2tog, sc in next 2 sts, sc2tog, ch1, turn.

Row 6: Sc in next 4 sts, ch1, turn.

Row 7: Place D ring and sc through D ring 4 sts. Fasten off. Rep on other side.

Weave in all ends, and attach strap. Pin zipper along opening, and hand stitch into place.

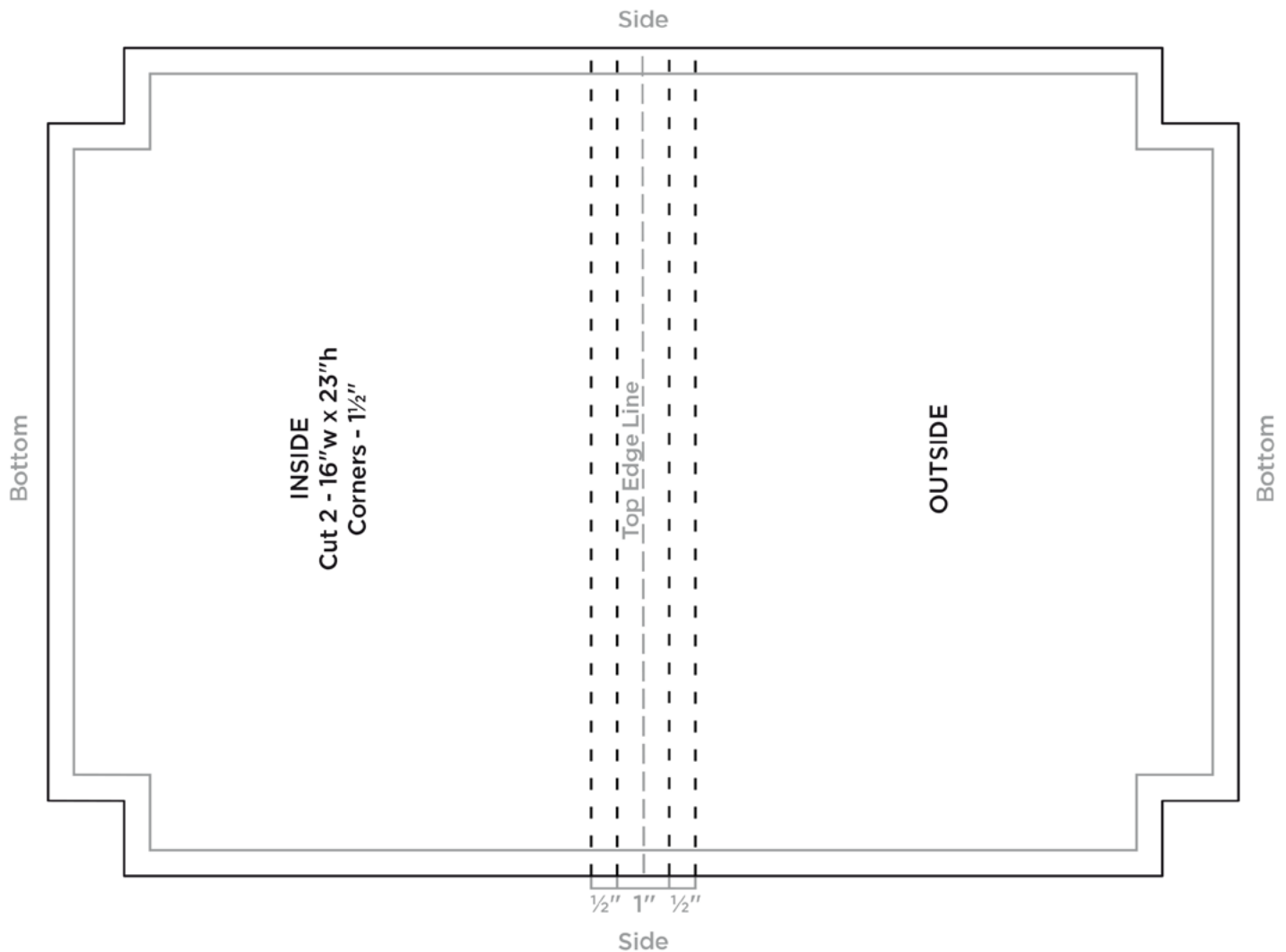
TOTE LINING

SCALED AT 30%
Seam Allowance: 1/2"

Running Stitch: - - - - -

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Sew long sides of both pieces with right sides together.
2. Fold tube in half (wrong sides together), and press to mark top of bag.
3. Make a stitch 1" down from top edge and another stitch 1/2" from first to accommodate paracord.
4. Turn piece wrong side out, and sew outside bottom line.
5. Align side stitch with bottom stitch, and sew open space perpendicularly.
6. Turn piece inside out. Close bottom open space, and press.
7. Remove stitch on outside sides (between stitches from step 3).
8. Insert length of paracord, going in and out on same side. Repeat for opposite side.
9. Adjust length as needed, and add a wood bead and knot to secure.

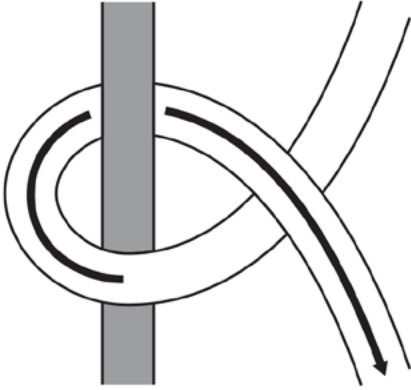

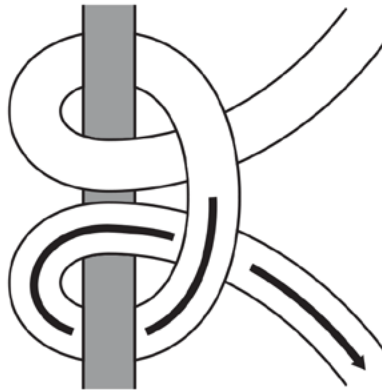
KNOT DIAGRAMS (1 of 7)

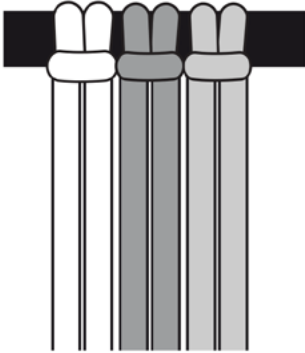

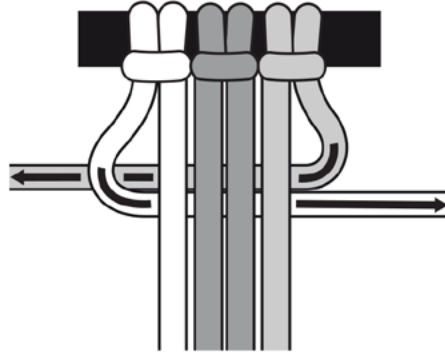

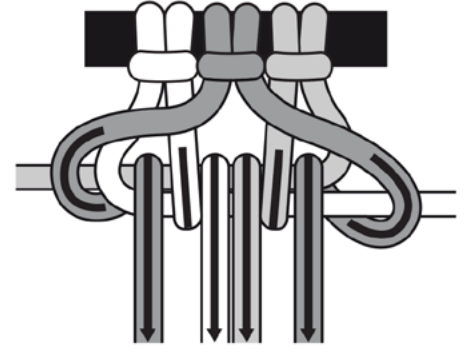
MODIFIED CHAIN WRAP

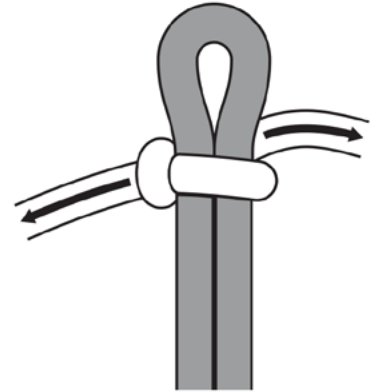
COBRA KNOT



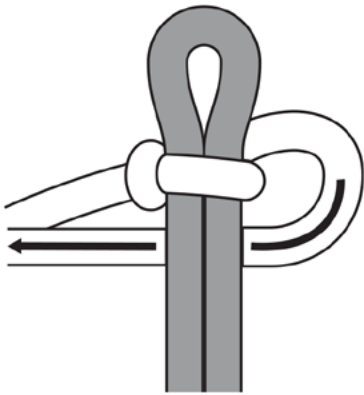

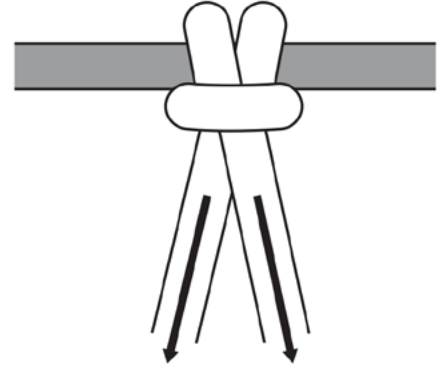
LARK'S HEAD KNOT

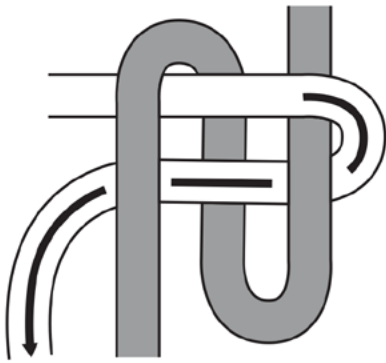

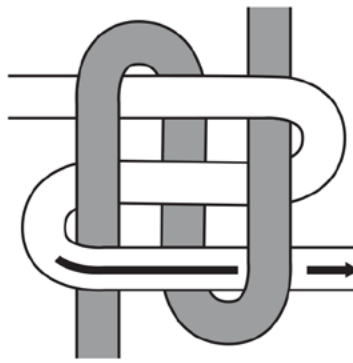

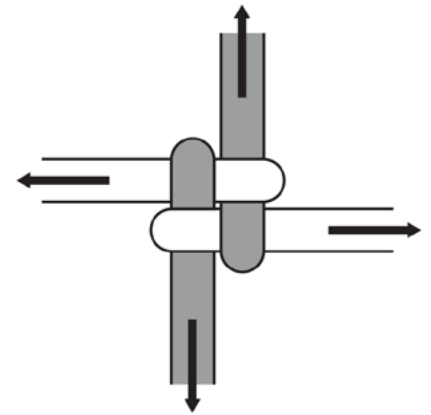
JAPANESE SQUARE KNOT

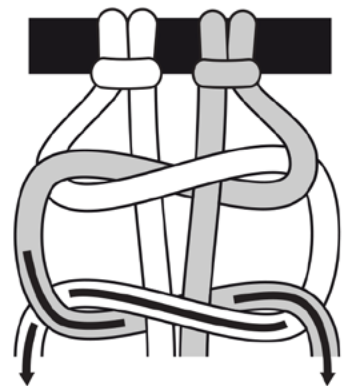

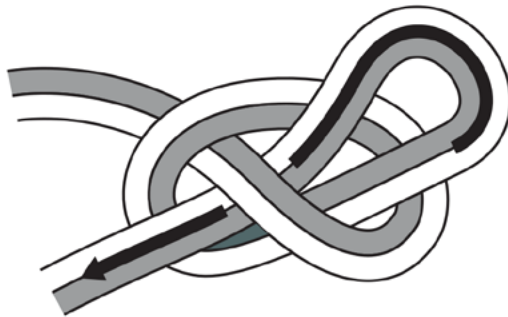

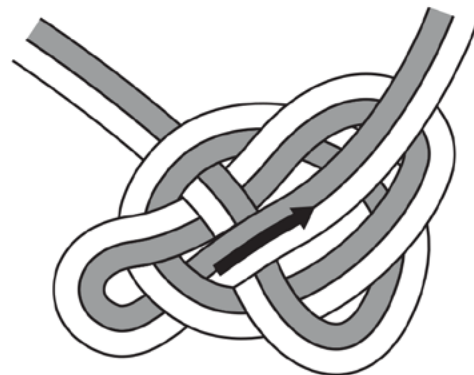

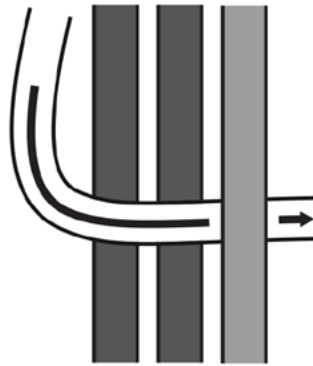

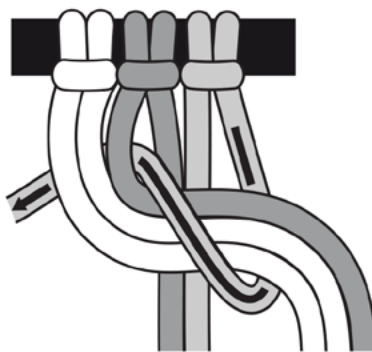

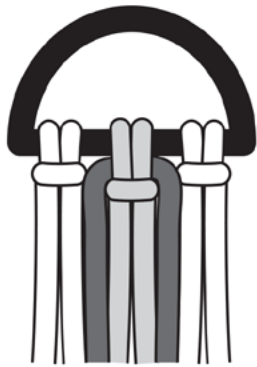
