

B-UTIFUL LETTERS

For the groovy flowers on this embellished wooden letter, a compass is your best friend! Trace perfectcircle guides onto the letter, then piece together petals and stems from tiles or gems. Fill in any empty space with smaller pieces.

GLASS GLOBES

Both the round gems and the triangle mosaic tiles used for these vasesturned-candle-holders come pre-cut and ready to go! All you need to do is adhere them (with super glue) and apply the grout.







CHIME IN

To make this wind chime, hang foam balls covered in mosaic tiles and grout, along with an assortment of wire-wrapped gems, from the lid of a wooden box.

Tip: Before grouting and tiling the box top, drill holes to accommodate hardware.



MOUNTAIN LINE

The mountains are calling in this beginner-friendly mosaic—there's no grouting or cutting required! Draw your design on a dry tree stump, and then adhere an assortment of mosaic tiles and stained-glass pieces into place.

▼ CUTE AS A BUTTON

These fungi friends keep it light (and easy to move around!) because their bases are made out of foam. Start by cutting foam cones (the stems) and foam balls (the caps) in half. Then work your way up, adhering mosaic tiles to the bottom and mosaic pebbles to the top.

Tip: Mix red and black acrylic paint into white grout to get the bright red shade used on the caps.









On the Cover:

Leave off the grout to let the exterior of your favorite vase (find this one in the Home Décor Department) peek through the glass pieces.

ROCK SOLID

To create intricate, detailed designs, like these flowers and bumblebee, trade wheeled glass nippers for tile nippers. They're more precise when you're cutting teeny-tiny pieces. Finish by outlining your designs with a chain necklace from the Jewelry Making Department.
