IN ONE BASKET >

When you're arranging flowers in a relatively large container, like this bamboo wall basket, be mindful to keep the florals the star of the show. Big, eye-catching blooms, paired with bare branches and wispy greenery, can help to balance out the look.

Bouquets Used: I, J and M

THE BOUQUET WAY

These tulips are made from a sturdy polymer material (instead of silk) to make them look and feel like the real thing! Pair them with greenery and a few roses to fill out your bouquet, and tie it all together with burlap ribbon.

Bouquets Used: B, J and L

TOP THIS

For this boho wedding décor, insert pink dahlias, white anemones, blush peonies and other neutral blooms into a foam wreath (glued just under the top of the cake stand). Then tuck in romantic trailing greenery in muted colorways to complete the soft, natural aesthetic.

Bouquets Used: D, H and K





TRY A TRIANGLE

The unexpected base for these hanging florals: a macrame triangle (found in Crafts!) Hot glue cuttings from a pink dahlia bundle and a rose, anemone & succulent bouquet to the metal, and secure them with clear cording. Then tie a ribbon at the top for hanging.

Bouquets Used: D and K

SUNFLOWER DAYS

You can make bright florals, like these cheery sunflowers, pop even more by surrounding them with white flowers. To get started, place floral foam in a metal container and add in the largest blooms. Then layer in greenery, and finally, smaller florals and branches.

Bouquets Used: A and F



HAVE IT MADE >

Along with being more cost-effective than individual floral stems, readymade bouquets also give you a great head start on creating a cohesive color palette for your floral arrangements. Case in point: This classic combination of red, pink and white blooms.

Bouquets Used: E, G and M

COMING UP ROSES

Create your own version of living wall décor (without the upkeep) using readymade bouquets. Paint a canvas as desired, then hot glue a mix of greenery alongside pastel peonies and ranunculus for a 3D masterpiece.

Bouquets Used: B and J



Tip: Hot glue natural hog huck branches around a glass vase and secure them with rubber bands until the glue dries.
