Under Cover

Flannel is a great choice when it comes to making blankets. The medium-weight cotton fabric traps heat but is also breathable, resulting in a comfortably cozy feel! And for extra style points, blanket stitch all around and attach pompoms or tassels.

Best Foot Forward

If you want to jump into flannel feet first, these slippers are for you! For the soles, layer batting between grip fabric and flannel, cut out foot shapes, and quilt them together. Then create both top pieces (more batting and flannel), and sew everything together.





Warm Up

Here's the how-to for this flannel scarf: Cut a rectangle of fabric (size as desired) and six strips of leather. Fold the fabric lengthwise, right sides together, and sandwich three strips of leather at each end. Sew around, turn, and close, then add snaps to connect the leather strips.

Flower Power

Flannel doesn't have to be plaid—the cozy fabric comes in solid colors too! For this daisy plushie, create the petal, center and stem pieces separately, then just sew them together. And FYI, the bunny is made from Simplicity S9306.



To turn the flower center into a pillow, attach it with hook-&-loop strips (instead of sewing) so it's detachable.



Sweet Dreams

With a trend-forward floral flannel design and layers of batting, this cushy creation is what DIY dreams are made of. And here's a thought: After completing the sleeping bag, you can use any extra fabric to make matching clothing for your kiddo's favorite plushie.



Set the Table

Invite warm and welcoming vibes to your dining room with a flannel tablecloth. Try pairing a classic flannel pattern, like plaid, buffalo check or tartan, with a thick solid-colored border to add a modern feel to an otherwise traditional look.

Puppy Love

Make your canine companion bark for joy with a flannel dog coat. This version (courtesy of Simplicity 1239, option A) features a puppy pattern on the outside and a classic buffalo check lining.

Tip: Add batting between your fabric for extra weight and warmth.
