LET'S EAR ABOUT IT

Get ready to party in these dazzling metallic beauties. The gold earrings are just pairs of jump rings linked together in a chain (no extra charms required!). To create the dangling silver-and-gold earrings, string metallic cube beads onto headpins, and fold the ends over a bulb-shaped wire.



IN THE LOOP

When it comes to earrings, seed beads and clear cord are a dream team. You can weave them into a shape (left), secure them to readymade hoop earrings (center), or simply attach them to findings with crimp tubes (right).



BOHO BEAUTIES

Macrame: Tie four pieces of hemp cord onto brass jump rings, then add square knots and seed beads. **Wood:** For a beginner-friendly project, simply string wood beads onto readymade hoop earrings. Or slide them onto copper wire, then shape it into an oval.



SILVER AGE

Teardrop: Three beads (with leaf bead caps) threaded onto eye pins and attached to silver teardrop hoops on ear wires.

Three-ring: Three 12mm jump rings, each adorned with holographic glass beads and linked pairs of 6mm jump rings, and ball posts.

FLOWER CHILD

For these floating floral earrings, partially fill a bezel with resin, then cure it with a UV light. Add pressed wildflowers, and then pour one more layer of resin on top.

Tip: To keep UV resin from sticking, a non-porous work surface is a must.



On the Cover: *The common denominators for these chic earrings: gold findings and gemstone beads (including jasper, imitation stone, amethyst, amazonite and Indian agate).*



STUD-Y BREAK

These super cute earrings are super easy to make. **Teardrops:** Attach faceted teardrop charms to gold ball earring posts.

Studs: Pluck beads from strands of amazonite, strawberry quartz, white jade and other crystals, then super glue them onto headpins.
