THINK INK

To give paper tags a marbled effect, add a few drops of alcohol ink and tilt the tags to spread the color. Then allow the tags to dry, and adhere gold leaf for a little shine.

Tip: Brush on decoupage medium before dyeing the tags—it'll keep the ink from soaking through.





▲ TAGS, THEY'RE IT!

FYI for these DIY party favors: Start by stamping a text background onto white tags and attaching them to wooden "Thank You" tags. Then tie them onto glass bottles with faux suede cord and embellish with ginkgo leaves and a wax seal.

◀ MAKE YOUR MARK

Craft tags + vinyl + tassels = vibrant bookmarks! We chose acrylic tags—they're more durable than paper ones. And since they're transparent, you can add the vinyl patterns on one side and lettering on the other to give the design even more dimension.

These interchangeable months are cardstock backed with magnets (we used a cutting machine to create the lettering), mounted on a custom-cut piece of balsa.



TIME TO TAG

Wood craft tags—embellished with painted wooden numbers and florals—were perfect for the dates on this DIY calendar (an easel from the bare wood aisle). Clip the tags together with binder rings so they're easy to flip through, and then hang them on a wooden dowel.

ON THE COVER:

If you find yourself scrambling to make last-minute cards, try keeping a tag book on hand. It's a compilation of all your adorable DIY tags, strung together and ready for any occasion.

TAG ALONG ▶

Adding a tag to a 3D card is an easy addition, but it really helps your design pop off the page. We embossed ours to give it a little something extra.

P.S. This handmade card features a bouquet of floral embellishments wrapped in crinkle scrapbook paper.

TAG TEAM ▼

Birthday Banner: Alphabet stickers on banner tags, backed with glitter paper and hung with thin washi tape.

Tags: Ornate and blank tags embellished with stamps, 3D stickers, glitter, floral paper and ribbon.



EMBOSS AROUND

Two methods for embossing gift tags:

1. Embossing pens and powder (if you want to write or draw freehand).
2. Clear stamps, embossing stamp pad and powder (an easy way to get a clean look).
