1. Welcome Home

Add a splash of color to your entryway with a welcome sign featuring sea quest mosaic tiles and white glass pebbles.

Our advice: Draw out the word and glue on the pebbles first. Then adhere the tiles around it.

P.S. Mix black and white grout to create a grayish hue.

2. Fun in the Sun

Brighten up your home by creating mosaic sun art out of colorfully reflective mirror tiles. The glass pieces come pre-cut as trapezoids, but you can cut them into strips with wheeled nippers.

Tip: Dye your grout with craft paint to match your design.

3. By the Book

Give your favorite page-turners a happy new home with mosaic bookends. We DIY'd each bookend using basswood (two pieces glued together into a 90° angle) and a 2D bare-wood house, and then we covered them in mosaic pieces: pre-cut squares and custom-cut stained glass.

4. Beauty in Bloom

We treated this flowery mosaic project like a puzzle. How? By custom-cutting all of the mosaic pieces (seashell chips and stained-glass tiles) to fit snugly around a readymade floral wood wreath. Just brush the wreath with tile adhesive and place the pieces.

5. Bottle Behavior

Even small-scale mosaic DIYs, like the stained glass-inspired art on these decorative bottles, can make a big impact.

Pro tip: When you're cutting your glass pieces, don't worry about perfection. Keeping the design abstract will give it a one-of-a-kind quality!

6. Go, Cart!

Mini classico mosaic tiles took this wooden cart from drink station to statement piece! Draw a design on the cart, adhere tiles $\frac{1}{8}$ " apart, and add grout. Use a damp sponge to remove excess grout, and then apply a clear sealant. Now you're ready to rock and roll!

7. Make a Splash

Thanks to a medley of mosaic pieces and black grout, we updated this backsplash without breaking the bank! There are tons of different shapes, shades and sizes of pre-cut mosaic tiles and gems to choose from, so you can create a stunning look to match your kitchen!

On the Cover:

Adhere mosaic pieces to a bare wood frame with tile adhesive. Then spread pre-mixed grout over the pieces, let the frame dry 15 minutes, and buff it clean.

For extra texture, fill in large, empty sections of grout with glass mosaic pebbles.
