TREE TIME

The key to turning a glass jar into a tree trunk? Wrapping clay around the jar, then shaping the clay with a bark mold. Just add paint, and you're done!

DIY Mini Tree: Cover a floral foam cone with moss, then decorate away!

SIMPLY AUTUMN

To style this effortlessly chic tabletop décor, curate a collection of amber glass bottles (odd numbers make displays look more natural) and elevate the look with leather lace.

NEW GLASS-ICS

When leaves are falling and rustic vibes are calling, transform glass bottles into sculptural décor with wood rings and air-dry clay, then embellish with a texture finish and raffia.



Finishes shown: coarse texture spray paint (left), coarse texture medium (middle), modeling paste (right).



For the best cure—and to stop runaway resin—place resin under UV light immediately after application.



THERE SHE GROWS...

If you've got a green thumb, this tip's for you: 4oz glass cylinders are the perfect size and shape for propagating plants. (Bonus: A DIY wood-burned stand makes a beautiful home for your collection!)

SPRING LOADED

As vases, organizers and beyond, square glass jars are ultra-versatile containers. Get them display-ready with pressed wildflowers and UV resin. (Psst...you'll need a UV light to cure the resin).



WINTER WONDERLAND

Put your holiday spirit on display by etching stars onto a glass block and arranging cardstock “gingerbread” and artificial snow inside. Top off the cheerful diorama with a classic Christmas ribbon.

On the Cover: Turn the round glass bottle into autumn décor with etching cream (plaid pattern), foil wash tape (stripes), stained glass paint (leaves) and gold glass leading paint (leaf outlines).

BEACHY BLISS

Here's the three-step how-to for this summery candle holder!



SUPPLIES:

89-Ounce Glass Canister, Tissue Paper, Metal Leaf and Adhesive, Printer Paper, Decoupage Medium, Paintbrushes, Artist's Sponge, Adhesive Runner, Scissors, Inkjet Printer (not pictured)



STEP 1: To print custom pattern onto tissue paper, adhere edges of white tissue paper to printer paper and load into inkjet printer. Print desired design. Remove tissue paper from printer paper and cut out desired shapes.



STEP 2: Brush decoupage medium onto canister, position tissue paper shapes, and seal them with an additional coat of decoupage medium. Let dry.



STEP 3: Adhere metal leaf as desired and seal with decoupage medium. Let dry.

Optional: Fill canister with sand, seashells and LED candle.
