Décor With DIY Candles*



▲ *Spark Joy*

Mums: These mold-made candles are beginner-friendly and a great way to brighten up centerpieces—literally! **Roses:** Each flower is made petal by petal by rolling thin strips of wax into shape.

▼ *Why Knot?*

Thankfully, there's nothing to untangle when it comes to making these two-tone knot candles. Just pour wax into a silicone knot mold—mix in different colors for a more textured look—and insert a wick!



Brighter Side

Bring a charming, old-fashioned touch to gifts and décor by hand-dipping and hand-painting candles.

Tip: Water-based acrylic paint is your best bet here because it's safe to burn when dry.



When working with silicone molds, you'll need to poke a hole to accommodate the wick before adding wax.



For a longer-lasting burn, try soy wax and wooden wicks.

▲ *Light House*

Ceramic containers, vinyl labels, wooden wicks and mosaic gems all come together to create a high-end candle right at home!

Tip: Be sure to keep the rocks a safe distance from the wick.

▼ *Wish Granted*

Swap out traditional birthday candles for something more unique—and berry cute! These are made from a custom mold and non-toxic soy wax and dye, so go ahead and make extra-long wishes!





▲ *Picture Perfect*

Still searching for the perfect candle mold? Try making your own! You can use a rubber mold kit to form a cast of anything (faux pears, in this case).

▼ *Light Rock*

The secret to these trend-forward geode candles? Dyeing the cement mix! And for a little extra sparkle, insert gems along the outer edges before the cement hardens.



Find both stepping stone mix and gems in mosaic supplies.

On the Cover: Both of these eye-popping sculptural candles came from the same bubble cube mold. The right is a dyed, color blocked design, and the left adds height with a pillar-shaped DIY mold.

Fired Up

Make the most of mix-and-match stackable candles with a trip down the Baking aisle to discover even more mold shapes—like flowers, stars and geo designs! Stack them onto tapers or taper candles to pull off this look.



Flying Colors

For a color block effect, pour a layer of dyed wax into a mold and let it harden before adding the next color.
