## Bright Idea

A flocked finish on décor does wonders for adding a relaxed, cozy atmosphere to the home.

**Pro Tip:** Add extra layers of adhesive and flocking (once the previous layer has dried) for a fuller, fuzzier look.

## Flocked Flowers

Little touches make a big impact in this flocked diorama. Handcrafted, flocked paper flowers and a butterfly catch the eye, while wood mushrooms, a mini bridge and a bed of moss bring the look to life.



*This flocking shaker comes with a brush to help remove any excess powder.*



## **Light the Way**

A good mix of red and yellow flocking powder makes up this rich, terracotta hue. Can't find the exact color you're looking for? Just mix together two or three colors until you find the perfect shade!

## **Pretty Pumpkins**

Swap out your carving tools for some paint and flocking powder for vibrant, soft-to-the-touch pumpkin décor!

**Pro Tip:** Paint your project first, and then apply matching flocking to get full, even color coverage.





## **Flock Your Way**

Polka dot patterns don't have to be spot-on—not when it comes to this beginner-friendly, freehanded design. Just brush on dots of adhesive here, there and everywhere, then sprinkle on flocking powder.

## **Have a Ball**

Thinking of trying a different color palette for your tree? Then DIY flocked ornaments are the way to go! Grab a pack of ornaments (or any ornaments you have on hand) and flock your dream color scheme!

*On the Cover: Flocked frames come together in a flash! Just paint, brush on adhesive, and add flocking.*





## Time to Flock!

First time using flocking powder? Don't lose your head—just follow the steps to make this beginner-friendly project!



## Step 1

Paint bust same color as flocking powder and let dry.

**Note:** Paint 3-4 layers for best coverage.



## Step 2

Brush metal leaf adhesive onto bust and let set until it turns clear and tacky.



## Supplies

Black classic bust flower pot • Flocking powder  
Flocking shaker & brush • Acrylic paint • Paintbrush  
Dauber brush • Metal leaf adhesive



## Step 3

Apply flocking powder to bust with shaker, let set, then remove excess with flocking brush.



## What a Card!

A flocked greeting card is the perfect way to let that special someone know you're thinking of them. Just fill in or outline your design with a glue pen (sold in Paper Crafts), then add flocking for a textured pop of color.
