## CUSHION & PILLOWS

Can't decide on tie-dye techniques? Try them all! With an all-in-one tie-dye kit, you'll have enough supplies to mix and match, like on this DIY cushion set that features lots of different patterns and colors!





## COLOR-CHANGING DYE

Surprise! These projects feature a two-in-one dye that changes colors when exposed to sunlight. Apply it the same as you would regular dye...then watch the colors change right before your eyes! **Check out the Beach Towels and Awesome Accessories to see the designs before the color change.**

## AWESOME ACCESSORIES

Hats and headbands and scrunchies—oh my! With these tie-riffic accessories, you're in for a good hair day. Pair them with sticker or iron-on patches (baseball cap), plus seed bead flowers (bucket hat), for an all-around groovy look.

## BEACH TOWELS

These tie-dye towels are lining up to be a poolside staple! Use rubber bands to section off desired areas, then apply dye to the middle of each, leaving a little space on the sides to create crisp lines and spirals.

## CUSTOM JEWELRY

One tie-dye party kit = jewelry two ways! Necklaces: Cut fabric into strips and dye. Secure three strips together with pinch clasp. Braid strips together and add charms.

Bracelets: Dye elastic ribbon, secure pinch clasps to ends, then add charms.





## TIE-DYE PARTY

Looking for a unique birthday party activity? Tie-dye party kits are the way to go! Then stock up on ready-to-dye textiles (like crew socks and T-shirts in all sizes) from the Wearable Art Department. Let's get the party started!

**On the Cover:** *The key to the comfiest cozy corner: personalized tie-dye pillows! Place a vinyl stencil on top of pillow covers before spraying on dye. Let dry, then remove vinyl to reveal!*

*Spritz your way to colorful custom creations with a tie-dye spray kit! The eight neon colors come pre-mixed and ready to use—just shake and spray away!*





## GIFT WRAP

Whatever your gifting style, tie-dye has you covered—literally! Tie a bow on top with ombre-dyed velvet ribbon, go sustainable with furoshiki-inspired muslin wraps, or sub classic wrapping paper for duck cloth fabric.



## **GLOW-IN-THE-DARK DYE**

Talk about a glow up! One key difference to remember when working with glow-in-the-dark dye: apply it to dry fabrics, not damp! Aside from this, the process is identical to working with regular (and color-changing) tie-dye pigments.

## TABLECLOTH & NAPKINS

Set the scene at your next dinner party with a statement-making tablecloth (thanks, accordion tie-dye technique!). Bonus points if your napkins match, too!



## CROCHET PURSE

When tie-dyeing crochet projects, you can't go wrong with white I Love This Cotton! yarn (tie-dye works best on 100% cotton yarn). Crochet individual sections and pieces first, dye them as desired, then assemble your final creation.



# CROCHET PURSE PATTERN

**SKILL LEVEL: BEGINNER**

## ABBREVIATIONS:

<b>beg</b>	beginning
<b>ch</b>	chain
<b>dc</b>	double crochet
<b>rnd</b>	round
<b>sl st</b>	slip stitch
<b>st(s)</b>	stitch(es)
<b>tr</b>	treble crochet

**FINISHED SIZE:** 22" x 12"

**MEASUREMENTS:** Each square is approx. 11" x 11"

## MATERIALS

- I Love This Cotton™, 3.5 oz (100 g) skein of 180 yds (165 m):  
White – 6 skeins
- US size H (5.0 mm) crochet hook
- Yarn needle
- Fabric lining
- Fusible interface
- Tie-dye kit
- Chain straps

**GAUGE:** 14 sts and 7 rows = 4 inch square of dc's

## INSTRUCTIONS:

### MAKE 5

Pattern is made with double strands of yarn throughout.

Make magic ring.

**Rnd 1:** Ch 4, (counts as tr throughout), 3dc in ring, \*(tr, 3dc) into ring \*(3 total times), sl st to the top of ch 4 to join. (16 sts)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 4, 2dc in the same st, dc in next 3 sts, \*(2dc, tr, 2dc) in next st, dc in next 3 sts \*(3 total times), 2dc in the same st as beg ch 4, sl st to the top of ch 4. (32 sts)

**Rnd 3:** Ch 4, 2dc in the same st, dc in next 7 sts, \*(2dc, tr, 2dc) in next st, dc in next 7 sts \*(3 total times), 2dc in the same st as beg ch 4, sl st to the top of ch 4. (48 sts)

**Rnd 4:** Ch 4, 2dc in the same st, dc in next 11 sts, \*(2dc, tr, 2dc) in next st, dc in next 11 sts \*(3 total times), 2dc in the same st as beg ch 4, sl st to the top of ch 4. (64 sts)

**Rnd 5:** Ch 4, 2dc in the same st, dc in next 15 sts, \*(2dc, tr, 2dc) in next st, dc in next 15 sts \*(3 total times), 2dc in the same st as beg ch 4, sl st to the top of ch 4. (80 sts)

**Rnd 6:** Ch 4, 2dc in the same st, dc in next 19 sts, \*(2dc, tr, 2dc) in next st, dc in next 19 sts \*(3 total times), 2dc in the same st as beg ch 4, sl st to the top of ch 4. (96 sts)

**Rnd 7:** Ch 4, 2dc in the same st, dc in next 23 sts, \*(2dc, tr, 2dc) in next st, dc in next 23 sts \*(3 total times), 2dc in the same st as beg ch 4, sl st to the top of ch 4. (112 sts)

**Rnd 8:** Ch 4, 2dc in the same st, dc in next 27 sts, \*(2dc, tr, 2dc) in next st, dc in next 27 sts \*(3 total times), 2dc in the same st as beg ch 4, sl st to the top of ch 4. (128 sts)

## Tie-Dye squares as desired.

### Finishing:

- Sew four yarn squares together side by side, right sides out. Join ends together. Complete bottom by sewing fifth square to previous piece, matching corners.
- With lining fabric, cut rectangle (45" x 12") and square (12" x 12"). Cut fusible interfacing, same sizes as lining fabric, and add to both pieces. Sew short ends of rectangle together with ½" seam allowance. Sew square piece to bottom of rectangle, right sides together, using ½" seam allowance. Add snap to lining pieces. Fold top edge of fabric piece, ½" to wrong side. Place fabric piece inside yarn piece. Align bottom squares and sides. Align folded fabric to edge of yarn piece. Sew around both pieces.
- Add chain straps.
- Cut 6' of yarn, fold in half, hold ends taut and twist until tight, make into bow, and sew onto purse.
