## *Table Runner*

Two layers of greenery—Colorado pine and pinecones & pine leaves—are the foundation of this lush runner. Pops of red complete the traditional look, thanks to faux pomegranates and the jolliest of holly berries.

*This tiered stand is made from candle holders glued between a set of three wood trays!*



*Mix in year-round faves—like blossom & berry bushes and ranunculus sprays—for a garden-fresh look!*

## Woodland Tiered Tray

Here's a beginner-friendly display: simply arrange winter greenery and décor on a tiered tray—no floral foam or wire required! Ready to level up? DIY tiny trees by adhering faux cedar and pine trimmings onto cardboard cones.

## Mini Tree

DIY your own mini Christmas tree with the help of a foam cone, saw grass bush, spiked fern sprays, and pine & pinecone picks. Just cover the cone in greenery, add your ornaments of choice, and top it with a star!

## Staircase Garland

The no-fail way to zhush up readymade garland? Start by adding primary florals (hydrangeas, ammi majus), fill in with greenery (eucalyptus, ash leaf, preserved ruscus, champagne cedar), and finish with embellishments (frosted ball picks, bells, bows).





## **Colorful Christmas Wreath**

Ornament picks and velvet bows make this wildflower wreath vibrantly festive.

And when the seasons change? Remove the wintry elements to reveal an everyday display!

## **Candle Centerpiece**

Glittery pinecones, cedar branches and blue hydrangeas set an icy forest scene—perfect for a trio of LED candles to cast a warm glow on snowy days.



*Gently shake pampas grass to remove loose plumes, and then spray with a floral protectant to avoid excess shedding.*

## **Boho Tree Topper**

Pampas grass and frosted crabapple picks make a dramatic statement on top of this boho-glam Christmas tree, while burlap poinsettias and glitter-covered pine & pinecone picks carry the antique-gold color scheme throughout.

## **Window Box Display**

A tip for creating large displays, like this window box: If the stems of your standout florals (magnolias and poinsettias here) are too short, tape them to wooden dowels for some extra height!



*DIY this lush garland by wiring together Norfolk pine sprays, pinecones & pine leaves branches, and glitter berry picks.*

**On the Cover:**  
*The queen flower of Christmas, poinsettia, is a must-have in a traditional arrangement. Complement the look with red-and-cream hydrangea stems, crabapple, sweet pea and mum picks.*



## **Christmas Entryway**

Curating a welcoming seasonal entryway is as easy as 1, 2, 3: *one* focal point (embellished botanical wreath), *two* balanced sides (magnolia leaf arrangement and pinecone-adorned candelabra), and *three* colors (green, brown, gold).
