Art House

Natural elements like river rocks, moss and branches incorporate organic color and texture into this rustic cottage display (built with balsa pieces and modeling paste on a wood painting panel).

3D Artwork

To recreate this Southwest art style, you'll need to visit the Floral (stone filler & river rocks), Art (paint & alcohol ink), Crafts (frame & driftwood) and Needle Art (crochet thread) Departments!



Combine stone filler and drops of alcohol ink into a plastic bag and shake for newly colored gems!



Resin Planters

River rocks + resin = eye-catching planters! Pour clear-cast resin onto one layer of decorative stones at a time, allowing it to cure in stages.

Tip: Repurpose a soap loaf mold (rectangle) or create a custom mold (oval) from plaster and foamboard.

Tic-Tac-Toe

Here's an easy way to elevate a game night classic! Paint sliced river rocks (they're larger and flatter than most stones, so they're perfect game pieces) and place them on a grid drawn on a basswood round. Game on!

Invisible Water Beads

Optical illusion? Yes, please! Make pearls, shells, stones and more appear to float by placing them in containers with already-expanded water beads. Then fill the containers with water for that crystal-clear look.



Zen Garden

Creating your own zen garden is as stress-free as using it! Simply fill a square wood riser (sold in sets of two!) with decorative and craft sand, then arrange succulent picks and mixed river rocks.



Photo Transfers

Transfer photos onto rocks in three steps! 1. Apply white paint onto a printed picture (this will create an opaque finish), let dry, then apply decoupage medium onto a stone. 2. While the decoupage medium is still wet, place the picture facedown onto the stone. 3. Once dry, gently rub away the picture with a damp cloth to reveal the transferred image.



Glue dowel rods together for a DIY mini rake.





Floral Centerpiece

Clear and colorful glass deco stone filler adds an elegant touch to a simple tulip and dill spray centerpiece. The secret to a lasting arrangement? Adhere the filler onto a half-foam ball before inserting floral picks.

Tip: Create faux geodes by adhering deco stones to large river rocks!

Dyed Water Beads

Water beads (they expand when placed in water!) bring a unique aesthetic and structure to your arrangements. The beads come clear, but you can dye them with food coloring to create one-of-a-kind looks.

On the Cover:
Cellophane is the key to keeping stones and other filler separate while you work, resulting in visibly cleaner layers. Just place cellophane between each layer, then remove excess as you go!
